The workshop covers recent developments in rigorous empirical research methods and applications in development economics. Impact evaluation of policy reforms has gained increasing importance in the recent fifteen years with a conspicuous increase in RCTs as well as other rigorous evaluation methods, particularly in the field of development economics, where large-scale RCTs are widespread nowadays. This development also led to a closer interaction between theory, empirical research and primary data collection, with inventive econometric methods being developed and tested, which are often tailored to specific impact evaluations. The workshop targets development economists who make use of impact evaluation methods but also invites applied econometricians with an interest in impact evaluation. The research workshop in Mannheim (29th November to 1st December 2017) will gather leading researchers in econometric impact evaluations for scientific discourse on methods and evaluations.
