

TOPIC

REFORMING THE EUROZONE: HOW TO HANDLE SOVEREIGN DEBT?

The challenges facing the Eurozone are multifaceted, with Greece still having a long road to recovery and Italy facing a dangerous mix of a large government deficit and an already high debt level. This Lunch Debate will be dedicated to discussing possible courses of action for the EU, if levels of sovereign debt become unsustainable. A special focus will be on how an insolvency procedure for sovereigns may be designed as well as the risks and opportunities this presents.

With the Eurogroup having agreed on a reform proposal for the EMU on 3 December 2018 (which foresees improved collective action clauses and the ESM assuming the role of a moderator in creditor negotiations), the topic will be of particular relevance given that the reforms are due to be implemented this year.

This ZEW Lunch Debate is jointly organised with EconPol Europe (European Network for Economic and Fiscal Policy Research) and will be based on an overview paper on possible design options for a sovereign debt restructuring mechanism, which will be published for the event. Frederik Eidam is a senior researcher in ZEW's "International Finance and Financial Management" Department. His research focuses on financial intermediation, financial stability, and sovereign debt. Eidam regularly contributes economic policy reports such as the one to the EU Commission on the creation of a European Capital Markets Union.



Friedrich Heinemann heads ZEW's Research Department "Corporate Taxation and Public Finance" and is a professor of economics at Heidelberg University. His research addresses federalism and European integration issues. Heinemann is a member of the Academic Advisory Board of the Berlin Institute for European Politics (IEP).

She gained experience as an economist specialising in Asia and the Middle-East-Africa region. From 2007 to 2011, she worked with Crédit Agricole Investment Bank's research teams in Paris and London.



Lucio Pench is Director for Fiscal Policy and the Policy Mix in the EC's DG ECFIN. In the Commission, he held positions as chief negotiator on the reform of the Stability and Growth Pact, as head of the fiscal policy and surveillance unit as well as member in the Group of Policy Advisers reporting to the Commission President.



Werner Mussler is the EU correspondent for the German daily Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung in Brussels. Previously, he worked at the FAZ central office in Frankfurt and with the German financial daily Handelsblatt. Prior to his engagement in journalism, he was a senior researcher at the University of Freiburg and the Max Planck Institute of Economics in Jena.
